Learning Updates

Little Wrens Update

Little Wren's Summer Term I has been all about gardening! The children have been having a great time planting sunflower seeds and watching them grow.

They have also explored the beautiful paintings of 'The Sunflowers' by Vincent Van Gogh and created their own versions of the sunflowers through painting and printing.

Another exciting project they have been working on is planting a sensory garden with basil and coriander.

Reading stories such as Jasper's Beanstalk by Mick Inkpen and Titch by Pat Hutchins has also helped them learn more about plants and how they need soil, water and sunlight to grow.

To celebrate the coronation of King Charles III, the children have been exploring his family pictures and talking about their own families. They have ordered pictures of him from when he was a baby, a child, and an adult, and made delicious fairy cakes to celebrate.

We have also been observing five tiny caterpillars, watching them grow and change, please feel free to come into our classroom and meet our caterpillars!

Robins Update

Robins class have really been enjoying their new text The King That Banned the Dark. They arrived in their classroom to find some unusual objects. Robins class predicted what the story may be about and enjoyed a snippet.





In Maths, we have been working hard on multiplication and division and the children have been practicing their timestables. Keep practicing on "Ht the Button" and "Times Table Rockstars". We have a new leaderboard dis-

In Science, we have been learning about plants and growth. We went on a plant hunt around our school, naming them. We learnt about the functions of the parts of them and even dissected some plants to get a closer

In Art, the children have been exploring drawing, perfecting the use of tone and shadow to make objects look 3D.







In DT, KSI children made kites—they designed and made their own kites. They have developed important skills to measure, cut and attach securely. In LKS2, children are making their own moveable vehicles. They have explored prototypes, designed them and made a moveable vehicle. The children will even use a simple electrical circuit to make a buzzer.



Eagles Update

It has been a productive opening to the Summer Term. Firstly, I would like to welcome Miss. McClurg to Eagles Class. She is currently completing her teacher training and will be working with us for the first half of the summer term. We hope that she will enjoy her time with us and gain valuable experience teaching our children.

In Maths, the children in Year 5 have been working with Miss McClurg and learning about Decimals, with a focus of adding and subtracting numbers to one and two decimal places. They will now move on to sequencing decimals before multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000.

Our Year 6 children have also been busy learning about decimals before the focus moved to a recap of Area and Perimeter. This week, we have been exploring the area of parallelograms and triangles.



In Literacy, the whole class have enjoyed exploring the opening of our new class text, 'Wild is the Wind'. This week, the children have been using relative clauses to add extra information about a noun in a sentence. I have been impressed by the way that the children in Year 6 have been able to apply the skills acquired in Literacy lessons to the Punctuation and Grammar past SATs papers that they have completed - keep up the hard work!





On Tuesday, the children in KS2 enjoyed their investigative task in Geography, during which they used marshmallows, straws and jelly to construct and test designs for an earthquake resistant building.



I would like to congratulate our Year 6 pupils on their tremendous efforts during their SATs last week. I was completely blown away by their determination and resilience and am so proud of each and every one of them. It was a pleasure to accompany the children on Friday's trip to Rose Farm Shop to celebrate all of their hard work—well done Year 6!

With increased participation, children will be able to work their way up from being a 'Wannabe' to a 'Rock Hero' on our school display and earn certificates for most improved response time and tables facts answered correctly.
