## Robins Update

Robins have been working really hard to develop multiplication and division methods. In Maths we have been practising timetables. In English, we have written our own stories, sharing structure of the King Who banned the Dark. Children had to choose something to ban—can you believe some of them chose school!

In Geography, the children have been learning about the 4 Countries that make up the UK as well as learning about capital cities.

In RE, we have been learning about Judaism and the fundamental beliefs. We recently visited a synagogue and explored the Jewish place of worship.

In DT children in KSI designed and made their own dips and dippers. In LKS children researched varieties of bread and made different types of bread—the garlic bread was particularly delicious!







Year 2-3 have also made moveable vehicles with an axle . They even incorporated a working circuit to give their vehicles a working horn.

Mr Allman led a fantastic DT project—Yr 1-2 explored different kite designs and shapes and then designed their very own. They

## Eagles Update

Summer Term is in full swing for Eagles Class - the children have been working hard across the curriculum and have taken the business of the final few weeks of term into their stride.

In Literacy, the children have enjoyed the work that they have done so far around our new class text, 'The Ways of the Wolf'. They have explored key vocabulary and phrases, refined their use of conjunctions to join together two related clauses and have also



explored the use of present perfect tense. The children will now apply these skills within a first-person description of wolves in the wild.

In Maths, the Year 5 children have been working on their second unit of Geometry based on Properties of Shape. So far, they have explored the difference between parallel and perpendicular lines



and investigated the difference between regular and irregular polygons. They have now moved on to looking at Reflection and Translation.

In Year 6, the children have also been studying Geometry. They have refined their protractor skills to draw and measure angles, investigated angles over a range of shapes and learnt about vertically opposite angles. They have now moved on to plotting co -ordinates and plotting translations and reflections.

In Science, the children have begun their new topic of Electricity. So far, the children have investigated series and parallel circuits, using appropriate symbols to draw both.



The KS2 children have enjoyed exploring Rivers and Coastlines in Geography. Over the course of the topic, they have looked at the features of a river, coastline erosion and the consequences faced by impacted areas.

Last week Years 5/6 took a trip to Chester Mosque and Islamic Centre. The children found it incredibly interesting to gain an insight into Islamic Worship and enjoyed finding out about the features of the Mosque. It was fantastic to observe the lunchtime prayer and the children were given ample opportunities to ask plenty of questions in order to support their class study of Islam.
