Teaching and Learning - pupils deserve the highest possible standard of teaching and support to help them learn

School will :

- promote the development of all our pupils as confident well-rounded learners: intellectually, spiritually, emotionally, morally, culturally and physically
- provide a broad and balanced curriculum in a lively, challenging and creative context
- encourage children to achieve their potential by fostering an enjoyment of learning and celebrating all aspects of success;
- know and nurture our pupils as individuals

Parents will :

- take an interest in what their child is learning
- praise their child for effort and good work

Pupils will:

- come to school ready to learn
- always do their best
- bring the equipment needed for their school day i.e. pencil cases, PE kits and any homework required

Attendance - pupils have a right to education and parents have a legal responsibility to make sure that children attend regularly

School will :

- inform parents as soon as possible if their child is absent without an explanation from home
- acknowledge good attendance and good punctuality

Parents will :

- make every effort to ensure that their child attends school regularly
- endeavour not to plan activities or absences during term time, unless in exceptional circumstances
- ensure their child arrives to school on time (by 9am at the latest) and is collected promptly at the end of the school day
- inform the school on the day or as soon as possible thereafter about any absence and the reason for it

Pupils will:

- attend regularly and arrive on time

Behaviour and discipline - pupils learn best in an orderly environment where everyone knows what is expected of them

School will :

- have a code of behaviour which creates a caring, inclusive Christian community where all feel valued and secure
- make sure that all staff, pupils and parents know what behaviour is expected
- develop confident children equipped with the skills, adaptability and resilience necessary to succeed in the modern world

Parents will :

- give support at home in maintaining good behaviour at school
- work with the school to find solutions in cases of unacceptable behaviour

Pupils will:

- keep school and class rules
- support other children to keep the class/school rules
- respect school property and the environment

Homework - learning at home has an important part to play in helping pupils to achieve

School will :

- keep parents informed about their arrangements for homework
- provide suitable materials and advice on homework and how to help with learning

Parents will :

- offer encouragement and support with learning at home
- encourage their child to read regularly and record this in their reading record.
- ensure children complete homework to the best of their ability and on time
- make sure that materials borrowed from school are returned

Pupils will:

- take home any work set or complete it at Homework Club.
- do homework and take it back to school on time
- read regularly and return books and other borrowed equipment to school
- ensure that book bags are in school daily

Communication - good communication between home and school is essential to make sure that pupils get the support they need

School will :

- tell parents about the work their child is doing
- make sure that parents have information about their child's progress and behaviour
- meet with parents to discuss their child's progress and to set targets for the future
- make sure that they listen to concerns and do their best to help

Parents will :

- tell school about anything which might affect their child's work or behaviour
- talk with teachers on parents' evenings or at other times about their child's progress
- raise concerns directly and promptly with the class teacher in a respectful and unthreatening manner

Pupils will:

- take home letters, notes & reports from school and give them to parents or carers
- talk with parents or carers and teachers about any worries in school
