Learning Updates

Robin's Class

In Robin's the children have been learning about toys old and new and exploring the book 'Major Glad, Major Dizzy.' We have been working really hard on our reading and practising our phonics.



In Mathematics, we have been exploring place value and practising our counting forwards and backwards, we have been reading and writing numbers and partitioning numbers.

In History, the children have been exploring how toys have changed over time. In PE, the children have been learning dance, they have learnt about how to make different sequences, how to count in beats and have had opportunities to work in groups to improvise and create motifs. In RE we have exploring creation and how God created the world. We went into our natural environment and explored how different and colourful God's world really is!

Eagle's Class

With our full learning timetable now up and running, it is full steam ahead in gles Class. The children have enjoyed ехploring the first pages of our key Literacy text for this half term; 'Shackleton's Journey' by William Grill. After being shown the front cover, a selection of items relating to the book and a quote from the narrative, the children were able to make appropriate predictions, supported by the evidence gathered. They were then asked to refine their dictionary skills, working in pairs to find definitions for new vocabulary, taken from the text.

Finally, after exploring the main character of Shackleton through a role on the wall, the children have begun to look at figurative language, using their knowledge of similes and metaphors to write a setting description about the frozen landscape of 'The Weddell Sea'.



In Maths, the Year 5 children have built on their knowledge of Roman Numerals, before beginning to explore place value within 100,000. In Year 6, the children have been developing their understanding of Ratio before moving on to looking at scale drawings.

The children have enjoyed exploring key vocabulary through a range of activities for both our History topic of 'The Stone Age' and our Science topic of 'Living Things and Their Habitats'. I look forward to introducing them to new knowledge across both topics as we move on through the term.

On a final note, I would like to commend the children for the mature and respectful manner in which they behaved when taken to Utkinton Village Hall to sign the book of condolence for HRH Queen Elizabeth II. We were all deeply saddened by her passing and the children represented our school superbly well - I am very proud of them all.
