ENGLISH

Shackleton's Journey

Writing an endurance narrative — with a focus on using vocabulary to convey mood and atmosphere, exploring the difference between vocabulary of informal speech and vocabulary appropriate to formal speech and writing, linking ideas within and across paragraphs using a wider range of cohesive devices and using figurative language.

Writing a magazine article—with a focus on use of the passive to affect the presentation of information in a sentence, use of headings and sub-headings to structure text, use of technical vocabulary and using formal language to report facts.

Each day, the children in Year 5/6 will complete a shared reading lesson to build the their confidence in answering reading comprehension and inference based questions and to build fluency in both their reading and writing. These sessions will be based on the novel 'Otherland' by Louie Stowell.

Place Value within 1,000,000 —focus on reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers to at least 1,000,000 and determining the value of each digit, counting forwards or backwards in steps of powers of 10 for any given number up to 1,000,000 and rounding any number up to 1,000,000 to the nearest 10, 100, 1,000, 10,000 and 100,000.

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Place value within 10,000,000— focus on reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers up to 10,000,000 and determining the value of each digit and solving number and practical problems that involve these skills. Children will also round any whole number to a required degree of accuracy.

Ratio and Proportion—focus on solving problems involving unequal sharing and grouping using knowledge of fractions and multiples, solving problems involving the relative sizes of two quantities where missing values can be found by using integer multiplication and division facts and solving problems involving similar shapes where the scale factor is known or can be found.
