


My staff and I would like to wish you a wonderful, restful half term. I would also like to extend a huge thank you to the whole school community for making me feel so welcome in my first half term here.

This week in Nursery we have been looking at the nursery rhyme, Ba Ba Black Sheep and the story 'Each Peach Pear Plum' by Janet and Allan Ahlberg. We have also been enjoying playing in our new construction shed.

Robins

Robin's class have been working really hard in Mathematics developing a strong understanding of the value of numbers. In Year 1, we have been working really hard on counting to 20 and recognising and writing numbers. Year 2 have been focusing on practising their 2s, 5s and 10s. Please support them in chanting them and listening to some of our times table songs at home as well as engaging in Times Table Rockstars. In Year 3, we have been focusing on finding 1, 10, 100 more or less.



In English, we have been writing our own stories. The children have a fantastic imagination and enjoyed reading them aloud. In history, we have really enjoyed exploring toys now and in the past and exploring what school is like today and how it was different in the past. In RE, we have been learning about Creation and Harvest time as a way that Christians thank God for all that we have. We have even learnt about how Harvest is celebrated in different countries. In Science, we have been exploring the properties of materials and have been doing lots of investigations to find out about what different materials are like. Year 3s have been learning about fossils and showed great enthusiasm when exploring some real fossils!



<u>Eagles</u>

As we near the end of what has been a busy, yet productive half term, I would like to congratulate the children in Eagles Class for their hard work and efforts over the past few weeks.

In English, the children are now applying the skills that they have acquired over the duration of this half term within their own endurance narrative based on our vehicle text of 'Shackleton's Journey'. I am impressed with what the children have written so far and am very much looking forward to reading their completed narratives at the end of the week.

In Maths, the Year 5 children have been exploring the operations of addition and subtraction, focusing in particular on adding whole numbers with more than 4 digits and subtracting whole numbers with more than 4 digits. In Year 6, the mathematical focus has turned to algebra, with the children eager to take on the challenge of finding and using rules and familiarising themselves with algebraic formulae.

Our weekly R.E lessons have this term been focused on the Creation aspect of the Big Story of Christianity. Recapping on the Creation story, the children explored how Christians believe that God created the world in 7 days, before determining the role of Christians in nurturing and taking care of the world around them. The focus then turned to The Fall. with the children investigating the events of Adam and Eve giving into the temptation of eating from the Tree of Knowledge. The children resisted temptation of their own when given a biscuit and some chocolate and being told not to eat it, before reflecting on this and producing an excellent newspaper report to recount the story of Adam and Eve.



In History, the children have enjoyed exploring life in the Stone Age, investigating both threats and assets to humans at the time before writing a detailed survival guide for hunter-gathers using their acquired knowledge.

Once again, I would like to thank and congratulate all children on their fantastic efforts and hard work since returning to school in September. I wish you all a very relaxing and safe half term!
