School continues to be a busy hive of activity. I thoroughly enjoyed teaching the whole school RE on Thursday 29th September. The children really enjoyed it and rose to the challenge of learning the whole bible in one morning!

We learnt that in RE and Worship we may learn about the many, many stories from the bible but they all slot into 'The Big Story.'

Children have created 'Big Story' boxes which show the key concepts that underpin Christianity and the main story that the bible tells.

Here are some pictures of the Big Story boxes with one of our children's explanations of the Big Story. Perhaps ask your child what they can tell you about God's Big Story!

Learning Updates

Robin's Class

In Robin's class we have been working towards writing our own stories! Children have been exploring different stories based on toys as models for our own writing. The children have been working really hard to apply their phonics!

In Mathematics, we have been practising our counting and number formation, reading and writing numbers, comparing and ordering them and looking at different ways to represent numbers— with base ten, place value grids and in words and numerals. The children have been working immensely hard on these skills and I feel very proud of them.

In History, we have been thinking of our favourite toys and describing them. Next week, we are hoping to be joined by grandparents to discuss the similarities and differences. In RE, the children have been learning about the creation story and can discuss what 'stewardship' means.



In Music, the children have been learning to clap in rhythms. We have learnt how to play some basic notes on the Ukuleles.





Eagle's Class

It has been a busy but productive 2 weeks in Eagles Class. In last week's Literacy lessons, the children were introduced to key skills, such as using hyphens to avoid ambiguity and using commas to punctuate parenthesis. This week, the children have been preparing to apply their knowledge of these skills by planning an incidental write - a diary entry written from the perspective of Shackleton, to describe the perils encountered when navigating the Weddell Sea.

In Maths, the Year 5 children have been busy navigating the number line up to 1,000,000 and comparing and ordering numbers within the same bracket. Similarly, the children in Year 6 have been focused on navigating the number line up to 10,000,000, alongside comparing and ordering 6-digit numbers. Across our recent Science lessons, the children have enjoyed completing research tasks to investigate the life cycles of birds and insects. They will then apply the knowledge that they have gained in order to compare the two, identifying similarities and differences.

This half term, the Key Stage 2 children are focusing on dance in P.E and have been eager to demonstrate their understanding of levels, travel, unison and canon over the last two lessons. I am very impressed with their group routines based on songs from The Greatest Showman and Hairspray.

It was fantastic to see the children develop their understanding of our Christian Value of Service within the context of Harvest, with each year group exploring a different story from the Bible before completing an act of service inspired by the story that they'd read. I am looking forward to the children sharing their acts of service with family members and loved ones at our Harvest Service on Friday.

For our Harvest Service this term we have focused on Harvest under the lens of our Christian Value of Service. Children from each year group explored a different bible story of Service.

Children presented their artwork and our foodbank donations in Church on Friday.
